## IMPORTANT INFORMATION ON GARBAGE PICKUP DATES

### THIS IS YOUR ONLY 2008 BOROUGH MAILING REGARDING GARBAGE AND RECYCLING:



Thank you for your continued support of the Borough's efforts to economically handle, collect and manage household domestic garbage and bulky household waste items, grass and brush collections, recycling of required materials, and the Autumn collection of leaves.

The Mayor and Borough Council solicit your assistance in preserving the appearance of our municipality. It has come to our attention that trash and recycling receptacles (boxes, cans, barrels, etc.) remain at the curbside either too far in advance of the scheduled collection days or longer than required after collection. **NO RECEPTACLES SHOULD BE PUT OUT AT THE CURB MORE THAN 24 HOURS IN ADVANCE OF PICKUP, AND SHOULD BE REMOVED WITHIN 24 HOURS AFTER PICKUP.**

# HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE COLLECTION ONE DAY PER WEEK

## TUESDAY, THURSDAY or FRIDAY

Please see both the *Garbage–Recycling Calendar, Page 7*, and the *Garbage Collection Zones (Street List), pages 8 & 9*, to determine your particular Zone and thus your day of the week for collection. Please have garbage out by 7am for pickup.

General Household Garbage is collected in the Borough, **ONCE PER WEEK**, on **Tuesdays, Thursdays, & Fridays**. However, please note changes that occur on the following **2008 Holidays**:  
Thanksgiving Day (**Thursday, November 27th**)

When these **Holidays** occur, **for that week only**, collections are all moved ahead one day. Collection for THANKSGIVING will be on Friday and the Friday route will be on Saturday. Please see both the 2008 Garbage–Recycling Calendar, page 7, and the Garbage Collection Zones Streets List, **pages 8 & 9**, of this flyer for further details.

Household Garbage is normal domestic garbage, which **does not include** Bulk Items, Construction Debris, Hazardous Waste, Recyclable Items, Grass, Brush and Garden Debris, and/or Leaves. Please see the information regarding BULK collection, Hazardous Waste, Recycling, Grass, Brush and Garden Debris, and Leaf Collection in other sections found in this flyer.

All disposed materials are taken to the Union County Utilities Authority's Resource Recovery Facility, on U. S. Route 1, in Rahway, New Jersey.

## SPECIAL BULK COLLECTION (SPRING & FALL)

Once in April and once in October, the Borough provides for a Special Collection of what is generally known as Bulk Waste. Bulk Items are further defined below under the Guidelines.

All Materials for disposal must be placed, separated from normal Household Garbage, Grass and Brush Materials, and Recyclable Materials, **by 7:00 A. M.** on the designated **MONDAY** as follows:

### BULK COLLECTION DATES

April 21 <sup>st</sup>	October 13 <sup>th</sup>	<b>ZONE 1A*</b>
April 28 <sup>th</sup>	October 20 <sup>th</sup>	<b>ZONE 1B*</b>
April 14 <sup>th</sup>	October 27 <sup>th</sup>	ZONE 2
April 7 <sup>th</sup>	October 6 <sup>st</sup>	ZONE 3

**\* Zone 1 is split - check street list for your street.**

- The streets located in each zone can be found on **pages 8 & 9** -

**While the actual collections may take more than one day** in a given zone, once the trucks have passed your street they will **NOT RETURN**.

**Please separate all metal items from the other bulk items such as rugs, carpeting, etc. as metals are to be collected separately.** All bulk materials for disposal must be placed at curbside **by 7:00 A.M.** on the designated **MONDAY**. **\*\*PLEASE NOTE:** washing machines, dryers, refrigerators, hotwater heaters, dehumidifiers, dishwashers, stoves, automotive tires & A/C units will **NOT** be taken during your BULK pick-up.

**\*\* WASHING MACHINES, DRYERS, REFRIGERATORS, HOTWATER HEATERS, DEHUMIDIFIERS, DISHWASHERS, STOVES & A/C UNITS WILL BE PICKED UP ALL YEAR LONG BUT FOR A SEPARATE FEE only. CALL 1-800-747-6265 TO MAKE AN APPOINTMENT.**

### BULK ITEM COLLECTION GUIDELINES

**Examples** of Bulk Items include, but are not limited to: furniture, carpet, mattresses, household items, etc.

**Rugs** and padding must be rolled and tied in liftable bundles and cannot be longer than four (4) feet in length.

**Tires** have to be taken to the county hazardous waste site. Please refer to the Hazardous Waste section on page 12.

## BULK ITEM COLLECTION GUIDELINES (con't)

**Gasoline** cans and gasoline-powered equipment will be taken, but **MUST BE EMPTIED OF ALL GASOLINE AND OIL.**

**Propane gas tanks must be taken to a propane supplier or dropped off at the DPW yard MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY 7:00 AM TO 3:00 PM. Tanks must be EMPTY.**

**Office machines** (such as telephones, answering machines, fax machines, computers, printers, copiers, monitors), televisions, VCR's, cameras, audio/stereo equipment and small appliances will not be taken. You may drop them off at the DPW Monday through Friday 7:00AM to 3:00 PM. **Please try to utilize FIRST** the Union County Computer and Electronic Collection Program. Please see Page 12 for complete details.

### BULK ITEMS AND RUBBISH THAT WILL **NOT** BE TAKEN

- **Washing machines, dryers, refrigerators, hotwater heaters, dehumidifiers, dishwashers, stoves & a/c units**
- **Automobile** parts (including tires on their rims or without rims) will not be collected.
- **Construction debris** and materials such as sheet rock, concrete, brick, lumber, plaster, roof shingles and other roofing materials, garage doors, etc. will not be collected.
- **Highly flammable, volatile liquids** will not be collected.

**Paint cans** are **to be recycled** if **completely empty and dry**. Cans with leftover LATEX paint can be disposed of in the regular domestic household collection **ONLY IF** lids have been removed and sufficient time has lapsed for paint to dry into a solid mass. **DO NOT POUR PAINT DOWN SINK OR STORM DRAINS, AS THIS IS A VIOLATION OF ENVIRONMENTAL LAWS.**

**Household batteries** may be brought to the Borough's Public Works yard located off Passaic Street between 7:30 A.M. and 3:00 P.M., Monday through Friday.

**Used motor oil** and **antifreeze** can be disposed of at the Borough's Public Works yard just off of Passaic Street between 7:30 A.M. & 3:00 P.M. Monday through Friday.

**Cardboard** and similar packing materials will not be collected, as they are to be recycled on the regular recycling day. Please see additional information under **Recycling, on Page 10 of this newsletter.**

**Firewood**, logs, trees, stumps, tree parts or any other type of garden waste will **NOT** be collected as bulk items. Please see additional information under **Grass, Brush, and Garden Debris Collection, on Page 6 of this newsletter.**

## CHRISTMAS TREE COLLECTION (LIMITED TIME DURATION)

Christmas Trees will be collected beginning on Monday, December 29, 2008 and extending until Tuesday, January 13, 2009. After this date please telephone 665-1076 to arrange for pickup. Please remove any plastic bags before placing at curb.

## GRASS, BRUSH, AND GARDEN DEBRIS (WEEKLY COLLECTION)

### MONDAYS ONLY (for all zones)

1. Grass, Brush, and Garden Debris will be collected **MONDAYS ONLY BOROUGH WIDE, in separate garbage cans without lids** or in Paper Leaf Bags, from April 7, 2008 through December 1, 2008. Containers must be placed at the curb by 7:00 A.M. each Monday.
2. **EXCEPTIONS TO COLLECTION SCHEDULE:** Memorial Day, Monday, May 26, 2008 will be moved to Wednesday, May 28, 2008; Labor Day, Monday, September 1, 2008 will be moved to Wednesday, September 3, 2008. Please see the 2008 Garbage-Recycling Collection Calendar on p.8 of this newsletter for specific collection days.
3. Grass Clippings, Leaves, and Small Twigs should be placed in **open** containers no larger than 32 gallons in size. **No** plastic bags will be accepted.
4. Branches four (4) inches in diameter and up to four (4) feet in length **MUST BE TIED AND BUNDLED** and placed at the curb. **ANYTHING EXCEEDING THIS SIZE WILL NOT BE TAKEN.**
5. **NO FIREWOOD, LOGS, TREES, or TREE STUMPS** will be collected.

# RECYCLING COLLECTION EVERY OTHER FRIDAY (entire Borough)

THE **RECYCLING** OF SELECTED MATERIALS  
IS **NOT VOLUNTARY**  
BUT IS **MANDATED** BY BOTH STATE AND BOROUGH LAW

1. Recycling Day is **every other Friday** for the entire Borough. Please see the 2008 Garbage - Recycling Calendar on Page 7 of this newsletter.
2. Recycled materials are collected, utilizing two different trucks, and should be placed neatly, in OPEN (**NO TOP**) containers at the curbside, separated from the normal garbage cans if this is also your garbage collection day.

## CONTAINERS FOR RECYCLING MATERIALS

3. **PAPER PRODUCTS:** Newspapers, Magazines, Junk Mail and Cardboard products. The paper products may be co-mingled in either a paper bag or pail. They may not be put out loose. Shredded paper must be in clear plastic bags.
4. **OTHER ITEMS FOR CURBSIDE PICKUP:** glass bottles and jars, aluminum and tin cans, plastic bottles from pourable liquids, milk and juice cartons, empty aerosol containers, empty and dried out quart and gallon latex paint cans (lids off), empty quart and gallon oil base paint cans (lids off). These items can all be **co-mingled** (put together) in one receptacle.
5. **PLEASE BE ADVISED** that due to heavy volumes of collected materials, or inclement weather, the Borough's contractor may extend his collections beyond 4:00 P.M. Friday into Saturday. If your materials are not picked up on Friday, you should leave them at the curbside for Saturday pickup.

# BOROUGH TREE REMOVAL PERMIT REQUIREMENTS

**Chapter 247 of the Code of Borough of New Providence states:**

No tree, in excess of four (4) inches in diameter measured one (1) foot above the ground, can be removed in the Borough of New Providence without first obtaining a tree removal permit from the Borough Clerk’s Office.

Any person, or persons, or company, etc. desiring to destroy and/or remove a tree of the above noted size, or larger, must first complete an application form for this permit, at the office of the Borough Clerk’s in the Municipal Building. Said application needs to include, among other requirements, a sketch of the affected property indicating the locations of all trees, including those that are desired to be removed.

If the number of trees is less than three (3) trees the Borough Clerk shall issue a permit as a matter of course.

If the number of trees to be removed is in excess of three (3) trees in total (when combined with prior applications, if any) the matter will be referred to the Borough Engineer, for a determination as to whether or not said application should be approved and the permit issued.

The permit fee for removal of trees is \$10 per tree.

Chapter 247-9 of the Code of Borough of New Providence describes the following penalties for tree removal without a permit (please see the [website](#) for complete code):

For OWNER or TENANT

\$100 per tree, up to the first three (3) trees  
\$300 per tree, in excess of first three (3) trees

FOR THE REMOVAL SERVICE OR CONTRACTOR

\$1000 per tree

## UNION COUNTY HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION PROGRAM

## SNOW PLOWING INFORMATION

The Borough's Department of Public Works is responsible for clearing snow and ice from approximately 45 miles of Borough streets and roads. The Union County Department of Public Works is responsible for Mountain Avenue, Passaic Street, Springfield Avenue and South Street). Both of their jobs become much more difficult when:

1. Snowfalls are continuous and temperatures stay below freezing. Snow accumulates faster than trucks can plow their routes.
2. Even with salt, snow and ice will not melt when temperatures fall below 32 degrees Fahrenheit, or 0 degrees Centigrade.
3. When cars and trucks are parked in the roadway (either legally or illegally), the plows are forced to maneuver around them, leaving snow behind. This causes the snow to accumulate in larger and larger windrows thereby narrowing the roadways.
4. Contractors plowing driveways leave piles of snow at the edge of the street and in the roads. This tends to cause piles that are far too large for the Borough trucks to be able to move and can damage both the trucks and the plows.
5. There is more ice accumulating on the roadways than snow. Ice is much more difficult to control than snow, due to the freezing or below freezing temperatures.
6. "Black Ice" forms on the roadway that is invisible to drivers.

### HELPFUL HINTS AS TO WHAT YOU CAN DO TO HELP THE SITUATION

1. Keep cars parked in your driveway for as long as possible.
2. When shoveling or plowing driveways put snow to the **right** as you face the street from your home. Our plows come from the **left**. If you improperly place the snow to the **left**, the plows will push it right across the front of your driveway when they pass.
3. DO NOT block fire hydrants with snow. This makes them difficult to spot by our volunteer firefighters. Instead, please clear the snow and ice from around the hydrant.
4. DO NOT place snow in the roadways. This is prohibited by Borough Ordinance. It also makes plowing and clean up by Borough forces more difficult.
5. BOROUGH ORDINANCE requires that homeowners clear their sidewalk for the entire width within 24 hours after a snow event ends.
6. Avoid using salt, as this tends to damage concrete. Instead treat icy sidewalks with a product that contains calcium chloride. Sand can also be used to increase traction. Please help your elderly or infirm neighbors who are unable to shovel their own walks.

## ADDITIONAL PUBLIC WORKS INFORMATION

The following additional Public Works related information is offered for your reference and use during Calendar Year 2008:

### 1. STREET LIGHTS:

The Borough pays for all street lighting, on both Borough and Union County streets. Even when an individual light is burned out it still appears on the bill. When a light is on all day long it usually means that the photoelectric cell, which activates the light, has burned out and the light itself will soon burn out. All residents are strongly encouraged to **please report** burned out street lights, or lights on all day long, by **calling the customer service telephone number** on your own individual electric bill. Report the utility pole number (Example: NP786E) found on the tag at "eye height," and its location (Example: corner of Livingston Avenue and Fourth Street or # XYZ Springfield Avenue).

### 2. TRAFFIC SIGNALS:

All traffic signals in the Borough, **except** for the New Jersey Transit Crossing Gates and Signals, even when located on Union County streets, are owned and maintained by the Borough. Due to the virtual necessity of these signals and the resultant liability if they are not fully functioning correctly, **please report** any burned out traffic signal bulbs or any other unusual condition to the Police Department by telephoning, as soon as possible, 665-1111. Each reported condition will be immediately checked out and repaired as soon as possible thereafter by either the Public Works Department or Contractor.

### 3. POT HOLES AND ADVERSE ROAD CONDITIONS:

Mountain Avenue, Passaic Street, Springfield Avenue and South Street are Union County streets and are maintained by The County of Union Department of Public Works. All other streets are Borough owned and maintained by the Borough of New Providence Department of Public Works.
