2020 Leaf Collection

Residents will have three (3) options for leaf collection this fall:

- 1. Put leaves in cans, open containers, or paper bags and place at curbside for Monday collection.**
Leaves, grass, brush, and garden debris are collected every Monday through December 14. Items must be placed at curb prior to 5AM.
- 2. You may purchase a permit to have your leaves vacuumed from the curb. Permit cost is \$55.00.**
(Fee is waived for seniors who receive a \$250 Senior Deduction, Disabled Person Deduction, or Widow of Senior/Disabled Person Deduction. Please note the Senior Deduction is not the same as the Property Tax Reimbursement or the Homestead Credit, and qualified individuals must meet income and age requirements set by State of NJ. To verify eligibility you may contact the Borough Clerk's Office 908-665-1400 x0.)

**NOTE: Sticks, rocks, or other debris may not be commingled into the leaf piles – they clog the vacuum!
Only leaves from your property are permitted.**

Residents on Union County Roads – If you live on Springfield Avenue, South Street, Passaic Street, or Mountain Avenue, leaves will be vacuumed by the Union County Public Works Department. Schedule will be on www.newprov.org when available. Please do not purchase a permit unless your house is on a corner and you specify the Borough Street where your leaves will be placed.

- 3. Have your landscaper collect leaves.** Landscapers are responsible for disposal of leaves and are not permitted to dump at DPW. If your landscaper plans to blow leaves into the curb they must follow the pickup schedule for your street and pay for a permit to have them vacuumed.

If you wish to purchase a permit your options are as follows:

Community Services Officer

The New Providence Police Department is pleased to announce that Detective David Rodriguez has been selected to serve as our agencies Community Services Officer. The Community Services Officer (CSO) role was designed to continue an interactive and collaborative relationship between the police and the community. The CSO will act as a personal contact for the Police Department, providing effective two-way communication. The CSO will be responsible for promoting awareness regarding community events, safety initiatives, and crime prevention/scam alerts through regular communications. Community members will in turn be able to contact the CSO with any questions and concerns or merely to find resources within the Borough.

Detective Rodriguez will also work with local organizations, leaders, and citizens on an array of ventures or activities. Community Service Officers also work side

by side with community groups to address specific problems and/or to work toward certain goals.

Detective David A. Rodriguez has 10 years of law enforcement experience, 7 ½ years of which has been spent serving the residents of New Providence. Detective Rodriguez graduated from both the Ocean County Police Academy and Kean University in 2009, with a Police Training Commission Certificate and Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice.

Detective Rodriguez currently serves as our agency's Resiliency Officer, Defensive Tactics Instructor, Expandable Baton Instructor, O.C. Spray Instructor, and Field Training Officer. He also retains several certifications including: Crisis Intervention, Alcotest, Standard Field Sobriety Test's, Not Even Once, and Peer Liaison.

Street Fair, Downtown Trick or Treating, and Holiday Festival Cancelled Due to COVID-19

Scarecrow Stroll and Two New Promotions Will Take Place

The New Providence Business Community, sponsor and organizer of the Street Fair, Downtown Trick or Treating, and Holiday Festival, regrets to announce that these events have been cancelled for 2020. The continuing impact on New Providence businesses as a result of the coronavirus pandemic is huge. Many businesses are struggling to survive, and are focused on retaining staff and customers, given the current operating guidelines. Business owners have neither the resources to fund nor the time to plan and run these large events.

"This was not an easy decision to make, but it is just not possible for us to sponsor and manage the upcoming Street Fair, Downtown Trick or Treat, or Holiday Festival this year," said Michelle Brugger, President of New Providence Business.

"Each of these events requires months of planning and large financial sponsorships. "We are so grateful for all of the support we are receiving from the community

and encourage everyone to continue to patronize our New Providence businesses," said Brugger. "We understand that many people will be disappointed that we cannot host these events, but we will be sponsoring a "Where's the Chair?" Promotion and a "Golden Ticket" Promotion this year. The promotions are fun and a great way for you to continue supporting our fantastic New Providence businesses that have supported you for so many years. Prizes (\$150) will be given for the best entry in each category:







Important Election Information



Governor Murphy signed Executive Orders Number 177 and 179 which address the November 3rd election procedures.

Every registered voter in New Providence will automatically receive a Vote-by-Mail ballot. Voters do not need to apply for a vote by mail application for this election. Ballots may be returned several ways: Your ballot will include a return postage-paid envelope, (no stamp necessary) which will be included in the VBM Ballot packet that you will receive. You may mail your ballot through the US Postal Service. You also may deposit your ballot in a secure drop box located at the entrance of the Library, 377 Elkwood Avenue, or you may deliver your ballot directly to the Board of Elections.

Ballots must be postmarked on or before November 3, 2020. Ballots postmarked by November 3rd and received by November 10th will also be counted. If you are using the secure drop box, the deadline for delivering your ballot is 8:00 pm on November 3, 2020. If you are delivering your ballot in-person, you may deliver it to the Board of Elections

Office up until 8 pm on November 3rd; the night of the General Election

The ballots will be mailed beginning in September. All voters will receive their ballots by the beginning of October.

You will not be permitted to vote on the machine if you go to your polling place. Voters who appear at the polling location will be permitted to vote ONLY on a Provisional Paper Ballot. Only voters with a disability may vote on an ADA accessible voting machine. The Board of Election will be assigning limited Polling Places available for voters on Election Day. You will be receiving a post card notifying you of the polling location in your municipality.
