10-21-10 – Patrolman Chad Wilson arrested Rodrigo Cruz, 27, of Bound Brook on an outstanding warrant out of Bound Brook. Patrolman Wilson observed Mr. Cruz operating an overweight vehicle on Union Avenue. He was also charged with operating the vehicle without a valid license.

10-22-10 – Patrolman Bryce Garrison responded to the Village Shopping Center on a report four intoxicated juveniles consuming vodka in the parking lot. Two female juveniles and two male juveniles were taken into custody and were released to their parents. Juvenile charges for underage possession of alcohol are pending.

Mr. Fischer was released with a court date after posting bail.
