7-14-10 – Theft of signs were reported stolen from a South Street church

7-14-10 – \$300 cash was reported stolen from a customer while at a Gales Drive business

7-15-10 – Patrolman Diamond charged Darrick Lee of Plainfield for operating an uninsured and unregistered motor vehicle

7-15-10 – An attempted purchase was made at a Passaic Street business using a stolen credit card.

7-16-10 – A Pine Way resident reported that a license plate stolen from a vehicle

7-16-10 – Criminal Mischief was reported to a parked motor vehicle on Spring Floral Drive

7-16-10 – Patrolman Wilson investigated a report of two individuals walking on the train tracks by Union Avenue, almost being struck by a passing train. Patrolman Wilson charged New Providence resident, James Barrett, for defiant trespass and underage possession of alcohol. New Providence resident, Benjamin Flint, was charged with defiant trespass.
