## *Press Release: March 24, 2011*

03-14-2011- Corporal Steve Opalewski arrested Jeffrey D. Gimprich, age 63, of Dumont for an outstanding warrant out of Newark after Mr. Gimprich was involved in a motor vehicle crash. He posted the bail and was released pending a court date with Newark.

03-14-2011- A resident of Spring Floral Drive reported her Facebook account was hacked and several emails were sent to her friends by the hacker who impersonated her while requesting money be sent to help her pay her bills. The fraud is currently under investigation.

03-15-2011- A resident of Bradford Street reported a fraudulent transaction to her debit card from a Duane Reade store in New York City. The fraud is currently under investigation by the Detective Bureau.

03-18-2011- A resident of the 800 block of Springfield Avenue reported suspicious activity has occurred at her residence in the last week. She indicated several people have come to her residence asking to see the house because it was listed for rent online.
