Press Release April 4, 2012

3-20-2012 – Detective Sean Bubb arrested Matthew Reviere, 18, of New Providence on an outstanding warrant issued by the New Providence Municipal Court. Mr. Reviere was released with a pending court date.

3-23-2012 – Patrols responded to Veteran's Park on a report of an intoxicated juvenile. Upon patrols arrival, they observed a 16 year old male covered in vomit that was severely intoxicated and disoriented. The parents of the juvenile responded to the scene prior to patrols arrival. The New Providence Rescue squad responded and transported the juvenile to Overlook Hospital.

3-24-2012 – Sergeant Frank Gaffney was on patrol at 11:45 PM and located a highly intoxicated 15 year old male on Elkwood Avenue. The report stated that while attempting to speak with the juvenile he was vomiting and nearly became unconscious. The New Providence Rescue Squad responded and transported the juvenile to Overlook Hospital.

3-26-2012 – Patrols responded to a Mountain Avenue residence on a reported burglary. The homeowner stated that she had arrived home after a short trip and observed that the backdoors to her residence were open and the lights had been left on by the apparent burglar. Jewelry and cash were removed from the master bedroom. Two, inoperable, antique firearms were stolen from a display in the basement of the residence. The resident reported that the burglary occurred sometime between 9:00 AM and 10:45 hours. The detective bureau is actively investigating this case.
