Press Release: November 14, 2012

10-25-2012- Corporal Steven Opalewski arrested Jonathan Estrada Veintimilla, age 23, of Orange, NJ on an outstanding warrant out of Livingston after the vehicle he was driving was observed with a cracked window and a brake light out. Mr. Estrada Veintimilla was found to be operating a vehicle while his license was suspended and was charged with the offense. The passenger who is the owner of the vehicle, Irizaira Padin, age 27, of West Orange was charged with the equipment violations and also for allowing the operation of an uninsured vehicle.

10-25-2012- Patrolman Andrew Diamond arrested William Sanchez-Hernandez, age 33, of Newark on outstanding warrants out of the Borough, Newark, and Secaucus after he was stopped for operating a vehicle while his license was suspended. Mr. Sanchez-Hernandez was charged with the motor vehicle offense and released after he posted bail for the warrants.

10-25-2012- Patrolman Andrew Diamond arrested Jerry Rodriguez, age 35, of Plainfield on an outstanding warrant out of North Plainfield after his vehicle was stopped for not displaying a name on a commercial vehicle and for towing an unregistered trailer. Both were released pending court dates.

The resident reported a printer was stolen from the vehicle. 11-09-2012- A resident of Knollwood Drive reported that she received scam phone calls from a man posing as an "Officer Cruz" of the IRS. The male told her that she owed the IRS money and she needed to go to the Wal-Mart to wire him the money she owed. The resident indicated that she knew it was a scam and wanted the incident documented in case anyone else receives phone calls like these.
