TITLE: RESOLUTION PERMITTING AMENDMENT TO TEAMSTER'S LOCAL 469 AGREEMENT CONCERNING HOLIDAYS IN 2012.

Councilperson Cucco submitted the following resolution, which was duly seconded by Councilperson Galluccio.

WHEREAS, Teamsters Local 469 has a provision in their latest collective bargaining agreement outlining annual holidays designated for their members, and;

WHEREAS, The Borough of new Providence has established a holiday scheduled for the year 2012 that includes Christmas Eve, December 24, 2012 and New Year's Eve, December 31, 2012 as designated holidays for the Borough, and;

WHEREAS, the membership of Teamsters Local 469 has requested in writing that their 2012 holiday schedule be adjusted to include the holidays outlined above, and;

WHEREAS, the Teamsters advised they would forego Monday, February 13, 2012 referred to as Lincoln's Birthday and October 8, 2012 referred to as Columbus Day for December 24th and December 31, 2012.

BE IT RESOLVED the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of New Providence, County of Union and State of New Jersey hereby approve the adjustment to the 2012 holiday schedule for the members of teamsters Local 469 as outlined herein.


