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# Memorandum

**Re:** **Municipal Center – Replacement Pergola at Centennial Park**

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I am recommending Council consider approving a purchase order for Ramsey Lumber in an amount not to exceed \$13,000. This project will replace the original wooden structure that was removed in the fall due to a serious rot condition. The replacement structure will look similar but will be constructed of a pre-finished fiberglass.

Quotes were requested of various providers with multiple options for materials. Two options were omitted; PVC Cellular plastic was more than double in cost and a less expensive aluminum product that was maxed out for spans and less durable. Three vendors quoted the same fiberglass product. This has the greatest strength and longest finish and material warranty. Another option, replacing with the same lumber was not considered. The maintenance cost is the highest for wood with almost annual painting required and the last wooden structure was structurally deficient after only ten years and had to be torn down due to safety concerns.

The requisition does not include installation. The product is shipped prefinished in a kit format. I will consider in-house installation or contracting with a local vendor after consulting with our public works director to see if this could work with their schedules and available talent.
