Press Release **April 7, 2021**

On March 22nd, New Providence Police, Fire and EMS responded to the 300 block of Central Avenue on a report of a motor vehicle crash involving a parked vehicle. As a result of this investigation, officers charged Thomas Terreano, 35, of Summit with driving while intoxicated. Mr. Terreano was transported to Overlook Hospital to be treated for a leg injury sustained during the crash. Mr. Terreano was also charged with possession of a toxic chemical inhalant, use of a toxic chemical inhalant, possession of drug paraphernalia, and possession of an open container in a motor vehicle and several other moving violations. He was released to a family member with a pending Superior Court date.

On March 26th, Peter Sempepos, 48, of New Providence was charged with driving while intoxicated, careless driving, operating an unsafe motor vehicle, leaving the scene of a motor vehicle accident, and failing to report a motor vehicle accident. The charges stem from officers investigating a report of an erratic driver on Springfield Avenue. Mr. Sempepos was located a short time later on Livingston Avenue. He was released to a family member with a pending court date.

On March 31st, Luis Bravo-Guerrero, 20, of New Providence was charged with driving while intoxicated, driving without a license, reckless driving, and several other moving violations. The charges stem from officers investigating an erratic driver report on South Street and that also drove across a lawn on Ethan Drive. Mr. Bravo-Guerrero was released to a family member with a pending court date.

On April 2nd, Antonio Samuel, 18, of Newark was charged with unlawful taking by means of conveyance. The charges stem from a report that Mr. Samuel had taken an electric bicycle from behind a Springfield Avenue business. The property was returned to the owner once patrols located the bicycle and Mr. Samuel. He was released with a pending court date.

On April 5th, an employee of a Springfield Avenue business reported that his bicycle was stolen from in front of the business between the hours of 2 PM and 4 PM.
